One of the major foci for the government and the Ministry of Education, across New Zealand, is to raise attendance. The target that they have set is to increase regular attendance so that 80% of all students are attending regularly. Regular attendance is defined as being at school at least 90% of the time. That equates to at least 9 days out of every 10 or a maximum of one day away a fortnight. All whānau were sent an e-mail outlining processes that we have put in place to support the Ministry goal.

Over this month, a number of our students have been involved in a variety of trips and activities. These have included various Careers and Gateway opportunities, such as Moving On for Year 13s, a Job Explore day in Whangārei for senior students and last week, Dargaville High School hosted a Careers Expo for all students.

There have also been a number of sports events and trips. Most recently, these have included the Northland Track and Field Championships on the 19th of March and the Touch Championships on the 14th of March. Our Senior Girls' Volleyball team are currently in Auckland, competing in the Secondary Schools Championship.

Furthermore, a number of senior students completed a Learner Licence course for three days' earlier in the week, and our EPro-8 Team competed in the regional EPro-8 competition in Whangārei on Wednesday. Our Police Academy students are at Wero Whitewater Park today.

Next week, a group of senior students are going to Polyfest in Auckland and a Health and Safety Course is being delivered at school. We have a site visit from ERO.

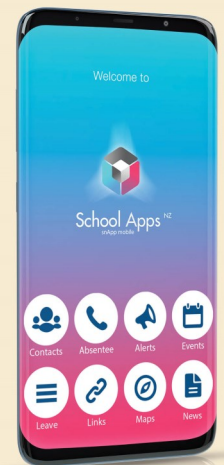
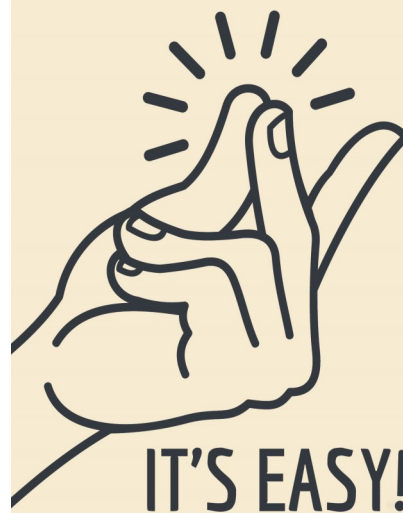
A number of students are involved in practices and rehearsals for Kapa Haka and for Show Quest. Our Kapa Haka roopu are preparing for the upcoming Tai Tokerau Festival. This year is the 50th anniversary and Opononi Area School are the hosts. Our roopu is performing at 4pm on Wednesday the 9th April 9. Show Quest is early next term, on 1st May.

The focus on learning continues and currently many of our senior students are working on NCEA assessments. In weeks 4 and 5 of next term, we have the first round of the Literacy and Numeracy Common Assessment Activities or CAAs, which will involve students across a number of year groups.
